


#### PILGRIMS AT THE CREEK

#### **OVERVIEW**

This public art project encourages reflection upon the natural world through the artist's contemplative and creative practice.

The selected artists will invite us all to pause, observe, breathe, contemplate and appreciate our natural world.

The resulting exhibition will be held on the fourth floor of the Noel C. Taylor Municipal Building, from October 2025 to May 2026.

It follows as another stepping stone of engagement in a program that began early 2025 with an 8-week study of Annie Dillard's *Pilgrim at Tinker Creek*, and subsequent related events along the new stretch of Greenway by Tinker Creek itself.





